# **PACE Report**

Officer Bev Hubbard reported crime stats covering the period of February 1 through March 9. There were two vandalisms (Midfield and Granby Park); three automobile larcenies (E. Kenmore, Carl and Midfield); two residential burglaries (Midfield and Woodfin). The hot item consistently being taken is GPS systems.

Two arrests have been made for various burglaries and they hope to connect those arrests to burglaries from our neighborhood.

## **Crime Prevention and Residential Security**

Officers Jodi Kowalski and Sandy Parker reported there is an effort to get all neighborhoods involved in the Neighborhood Watch program. Report any suspicious activity (call 911). Neighborhood Watch pamphlets were provided. The police department offers residential and business security surveys free of charge.

#### **Guest Speaker**

Rick Henn, Senior Project Manager, Norfolk Department of Development gave a Power Point presentation on the light rail project and citywide development projects. The light rail should be completed by the end of 2010.

### **Treasurer's Report**

Bruce Larson reported February revenue of \$961, expenses \$135.75, with an ending bank balance of \$1,527.92. The Mermaid Fund stands at \$58.

# <u>Fire Safety Reminder—Change Smoke Detector</u> Batteries Now

During Daylight Savings Time, Norfolk Fire-Rescue wants to remind everyone to change the battery in their smoke detectors. Additionally, Norfolk Fire-Rescue would like to remind all Norfolk residents about its **free Smoke Detector Program**. Any Norfolk resident in need of a smoke detector for their home should contact Norfolk Fire-Rescue at (757)

664-6604 and leave a message with contact information. Norfolk Fire-Rescue will arrange to have a smoke detector installed free of charge. It's also a good time to review these fire safety tips with your family:

- Prepare AND PRACTICE a family escape plan
- Keep all combustibles at least 3 feet from any heat source
- When cooking, never leave the kitchen and keep something in your hand (spoon, pot-holder, etc..) to remind you that you are cooking
- Wear close to the body clothing while cooking
- Keep clutter to a minimum everywhere in your home

# Home and Tax Assistance Available to Norfolk Residents

#### If you are 65 years of age or disabled...

Seniors and disabled residents who have an income of less than \$67,000 per year and a net worth of less than \$350,000 can have part of their real estate tax relieved. The amount of tax relief is based on a sliding income scale. To be eligible, you must be 65 years of age or totally and permanently disabled, must live in the property to be exempted, and combined income of owners and all relatives living in the home cannot exceed \$67,000 per year. Residents must apply every year for tax relief prior to June 1. Application forms can be obtained from the Commissioner of the Revenue's office on the 1st floor of City Hall, or at various satellite sites during the filing season. Call 441-1502 for dates and times.

# If you want to appeal your real estate assessment...

Residents who want to question their assessments can first contact the Assessor's Office. They may also formally appeal to the Real Estate Assessment Board of Appeals. Residents must file an appeal prior to May 31. Call the Assessor's Office at 664-4732 for information.

#### If you want to rehabilitate your home...

The Tax Abatement Program for Residential Rehabilitation, administered by the Department of Neighborhood Preservation, offers taxpayers an opportunity to improve residential, commercial or industrial structures and not pay full taxes on those improvements for 14 years. Increases in assessed value will not be recognized for taxes for the first 10 years, but will be recognized for taxes on a sliding scale in years 11 through 15 following the start of the tax abatement. Applications must be received prior to start of work on the project. Contact the Real Estate Assessor's Office at 664-4732 for more information.


