PACE Report - Officer Odell Davis

Larceny - 15, mostly on Cromwell - spare tires, laptop and cameras on seat. Tires are also being stolen from autos. Securing your personal items, when possible, is paramount to less larceny.

Copper pipe is being stolen from homes. Keep your access to the crawl space secured.

Truancy has been a problem at times. The police can pick up the truant student but must take him/her back to their school. Only if there is a continued truancy can the police turn to the courts for disciplinary action.

Officer Davis reports there has been an increase in the use of radar enforcement in the neighborhood, particularly on Thole Street.

October 11 stormwater topic is league's first EARNN presentation of new fiscal year

The Guest Speaker for the October SACL Civic League meeting was Fleta Jackson of Norfolk's Division of Stormwater Management.

According to Jackson storm water basically has three options for leaving your property, the best of which is directly back into the

ground replenishing the water table. The second way storm water leaves your property is the storm drain system. The third way water can leave property is through ditches that drain into waterways.

Leaves and debris clog the storm water drain system, and turns into sediment that smothers the habitat of marine life in the Lafayette River and Chesapeake Bay. Fertilizer runoff impacts dissolved oxygen in the river and bay. Homeowners should test their soil and make sure fertilizer is actually needed. If fertilizer must be applied, Jackson says not to fertilize if rain is in the forecast, and to measure carefully and apply the correct amount. Picking up after pets is also important to the health of the river and bay since pet droppings add to harmful bacteria levels in the water.

Jackson says that if you notice that the storm water system is not draining properly, or notice any illegal or strange discharges,

call the Storm Water Division at 823-4000. Jackson noted that during deluge downpours the storm drain system and pumps do become overwhelmed. Also, because Suburban Acres contains wetlands, some of those designated wetland areas and State waters cannot be altered, which may affect drainage. Much of the neighborhood's runoff goes directly into the Lafayette River watershed.

Jackson noted that the city of Norfolk operates under a storm water discharge permit. As of January 1st, tougher discharge regulations designed to help the health of the Chesapeake Bay kick in. A new "pollution diet" will reduce the amounts of nitrogen, phosphorus, and other substances in the City's allowed discharge.

Clothing, Angel Tree support needed for Suburban Park Elementary School

In addition to providing food baskets to needy families at Suburban Park Elementary School, the Civic League will undertake a clothing drive for our December meeting. The school converted to uniforms this year, and maintains a clothes closet for students who cannot afford to purchase the required clothing, and for the younger children who have "accidents." Here's how you can help:

Uniform Closet/Clothes Closet: There is a need for both boys and girls underwear in sizes 4 – 8 for the Pre-K and kindergarten children. The underwear should be new in the packaging (unwashed). There is also a need for khaki bottoms (pants or skirts) in these same sizes for the "accidents."

The school uniform is khaki colored pants, skirts, and jumpers and royal blue polo shirts. The uniform closet needs all of these clothing items in all children's sizes. (No "cargo" type pants, please.)

If you would like to contribute any of these items, please bring them to the December Civic League meeting. (This can be an ongoing action on your part any time of the school year.) The tree is located in the school and will have an "angel" with the sex, age, clothing size, and toy request for a child. *You can go into the lobby of the school and pick up an angel.* The gifts should be unwrapped in a bag with the student's Angel Tree number. The school will wrap and deliver the gifts.

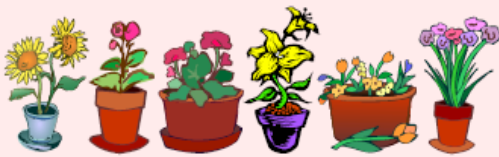

No local races for Suburban Park voters; tight congressional race and constitutional questions on ballot

The November 2nd statewide election has only one local race for Norfolk voters, the Superward 7 City Council seat vacated by Duan Hester. Hester was required to give up her council seat as a result of her unsuccessful bid for Mayor in the May 4, 2010 City election. Just across Tidewater Drive residents in Norview and Chesapeake Gardens will choose between Earl Fraley Jr., Phillip Hawkins Jr., Angelia Williams, and Jimmie Wilson to replace Hester. No other local offices are due for election.

Suburban Acres lies within Virginia's 3rd Congressional District. Incumbent Bobby Scott (D), Newport News is opposed by Norfolk Republican Party candidate C. L. "Chuck" Smith, New Kent independent John D. Kelly, and Libertarian Party candidate James J. Quigley of Hampton.

A much tighter race in the nearby 2nd Congressional District, which also covers portions of Norfolk features first term incumbent Democrat Glenn Nye. Nye is opposed by Republican Party Candidate Scott Rigell and former Republican operative Kenny Golden, who is running as an independent. All three candidates in the 2nd District race reside in Virginia Beach.

Three State constitutional amendments are on the ballot. The first proposed amendment concerns real estate tax exemptions for those over age 65. Currently the State constitution allows the General Assembly to give localities the power to completely or partially waive real estate taxes for property owners over age 65 who have "an extraordinary tax burden". If approved by voters the Constitution will be amended to allow the General Assembly to grant localities the leeway to establish their own income criteria for granting exemptions to those over age 65 in

owner-occupied properties.

Along the same lines ballot question number 2 would allow the General Assembly to enact legislation granting localities the ability to grant real estate tax exemption for veterans of any age who have a 100% service-connected disability.

The third proposed constitutional amendment increases the size of the Commonwealth's Revenue Stabilization Fund, or "rainy day fund" to 15% of the average annual tax revenue from income and sales taxes for the past three years. The fund is currently limited at 10% of revenue by the constitution.

SUBURBAN ACRES GREEN

Autumn is in full swing and the cooler weather means it's time for fall chores and preparing for the holidays. Here are some things you can do to help keep Norfolk green and make fall chores a little easier.

Give Leaves a Second Life as Fertilizer. Put leaves to work as nature's free fertilizer. Not only does raking and bagging require a lot of time and effort, hauling those leaves away requires the community to spend tax dollars needlessly and takes up limited landfill space. If your lawnmower is the mulching type, keep mowing your lawn weekly to chop up the leaves right back into the lawn, where they will add nutrients and improve the water retention of the lawn's soil. Or, if your lawnmower has a bagger, bag the leaves and use them as mulch on your flower and vegetable beds. Reduce the size of your lawn by creating mulched flower or shrub beds around your trees. You will have less lawn to mow next year and the beds will be a place for the leaves to fall, so you are getting a twofer! Never rake leaves into the street – it's illegal and the leaves clog storm drains when it

rains, or end up in creeks and ditches. This leads to street flooding, which makes more work (and tax dollars) for the City to clean out the storm drains and ditches.

Put Your Pipes on a Diet. Did

you know that the biggest week for calls to plumbers to fix clogged drains is the week of Thanksgiving? The City of Norfolk has an initiative to get us all to "Trash the Fat." When fat, oil, and grease (FOG) go down the drain, they stick to the walls of the pipes, restricting the flow of water. Clogged drains are expensive for you to fix, and when FOG gets into the sanitary sewers, our tax dollars are used to clear the blockages. Instead of pouring fatty liquids down the drain, pour them into a metal can (a soup can, pet food can, etc.), refrigerate or freeze until hard, then put the can in the trash. Food scraps should go into the trash rather than down the garbage disposal. Wipe off frying pans and plates with a paper towel to absorb the grease before washing. For more information on how to keep our sewers fat free, go to www.FatFreeDrains.com where you will also find information on proper disposal and recycling of fryer oil (for that deep fried Thanksgiving turkey).

One way of minimizing water runoff and lowering your water bill is by using rain barrels to catch and save water for garden use and irrigation. JoDee Cook is taking the names of people interested in a rain barrel class for the neighborhood; she currently needs two or three more interested persons in order to schedule a workshop for the neighborhood.

The presentation by Fleeta Jackson was the neighborhood's first EARNN (Environmental Awards for Recycling in Norfolk Neighborhoods) presentation for the City's new fiscal year: since more than 30 adults attended the presentation the civic league earned five points toward this year's EARNN contest. Last fiscal year SACL was the only civic league in the City to earn enough points for the maximum cash award of \$750.

Notes from Mayor's Wards Corner Task Force

The Wards Corner Taskforce met on October 14, 2010 at the Fitness and Wellness Center; Councilmen Barclay Winn and Andy Protogyrou were present. Issues reported on or discussed included:

- Pulse has opened up where the old Nutty Buddy's was located. It is a bar/club with DJ's playing "European" and "house" music. It is under the same ownership as Nutty Buddy's and owner Annette Stone gave a short presentation on her new concept.
- Elite Fitness 365 has opened in the northeast quadrant of the Corner. They have purchased new equipment and leased over 7500 square feet.
- The parking lot in the shopping center of the northwest quadrant is in need of repairs. The City is reaching out to the property owners and will report back.
- There are 114 active property maintenance cases reported in Denby Park (PD 38) through October 10th: 36 Code Enforcement Cases; 1 Code Enforcement Placard, Grass Abatement and Inoperable Vehicle; 65 Rental Inspection Cases; 7 Legal Notices for Trash and Debris; and 3 Legal Notices for Tall Weeds and Grass.

The next Taskforce meeting will be November 11, 2010 at 8:30am at the Fitness and Wellness Center.

Ways to provide financial support to Suburban Park Elementary

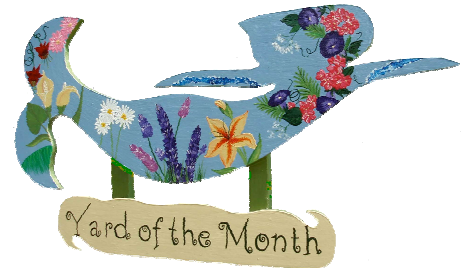

important. It will ensure that your heating system is running at peak energy efficiency, which is important for good air quality inside and outside your home and for the safety of your family.

And don't forget to change batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Fire departments recommend that you write a schedule on your calendar for replacing the batteries once a year. Some suggest replacing batteries when we

change the time from daylight savings to standard time each November. Others suggest you use the New Year as your reminder. It doesn't matter when you do it – the important thing is that you do it! There have been too many fire related deaths and injuries due to smoke detectors with bad batteries or no batteries. Don't become another statistic. We want you to enjoy the upcoming holidays!

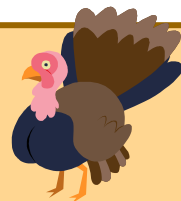
